GOOD SHEPHERD APPEAL




The Good Shepherd Appeal is one of our oldest appeals, dating back to 1902, and generations of schoolchildren have continued to support us by taking part. Across the last 10 years, the appeal has raised over £500,000 to support our work.

This appeal takes place during Lent, traditionally a time for giving, fasting and praying; a time when we think of others and use our gifts and talents to help those most in need. Jesus was called the Good Shepherd because he called himself the good shepherd in the Gospel of John in The Bible.

- **Give** Give, as much or as little as we, can and this can be our time to help to fundraise or carry out another act of kindness using our gifts, talents and skills.
- **Fast** Give up things we like such as sweets, chocolate, crisps, as well as any grudges we may have with others.
- **Pray** Show compassion, be empathetic and pray for those in need.

Pupils at all the schools taking part really use their imagination and come up with some amazing ideas that their friends and staff can take part in. From bake sales, sponsored silence, craft stalls, Spring fairs, talent shows, Easter bonnet parades, sponsored walks, the list is endless as to the creative endeavours and challenges that you can do to raise vital funds for us! How about a Nugent Young Heroes Dress Up Day (like a traditional own clothes day) or a Nugent Young Heroes Cape Competition? We look forward to seeing you ideas!



The theme for this year's Good Shepherd Appeal is ***The Feeding of the Five Thousand***, taken from the Gospel of John in The Bible (John 6:1-14). In this story, Jesus fed 5,000 people with two fish and five loaves.

This miracle is symbolic, as it not only shows the power of physically feeding those who were hungry, but also reminds us that we can use our gifts and talents given to us by God for the good and help of others.

One of Nugent's four key priorities is Poverty Alleviation, and we aim to tackle some of the root causes of poverty and give our children/communities the best chance of a poverty-free future.

SCHOOL'S OUT FOR SUMMER!


YOU CAN STILL HAVE FUN FUNDRAISING FOR US DURING THE SUMMER BREAK FROM SCHOOL.

MILLION PENNIES APPEAL

AN APPEAL OLDER THAN OUR GOOD SHEPHERD APPEAL TAKES ITS INSPIRATION FROM OUR FOUNDER, FATHER JAMES NUGENT WHO, IN 1854, ARRANGED A MEETING OF LEADING CITIZENS AND CHURCHMEN IN LIVERPOOL TOWN HALL.

His rallying cry was, '**save the boy.**' His concern was the plight of the thousands of homeless children who survived in squalor only by begging or stealing. One of the young people Father Nugent recalled in a speech was Tiny Bill:

"Please Sir! Will you spare a poor boy a copper to get a bit of bread with? Do Sir, I'm starving! I haven't tasted anything today. Father's dead and mothers sick and can't get work and we ain't got anything to buy nutting with. Do kind gentleman, just one penny."

The plight of these young people prompted Father Nugent to arrange **Save the Child**, meetings which took place at Liverpool Town Hall at which he campaigned for financial support to help those in need under the slogan: **Wanted: a million pennies to save the boy!** His rallying cry appeared in the Catholic Times in 1866, and collecting boxes were placed in public places across the city.

Some 167 years later, as Nugent embraces our 140th year we are reviving our founder's rallying cry with our **Million Pennies Appeal - children supporting children**. We are asking individuals, schools and businesses to try and collect as many pennies as they can from Wednesday 1 September 2021 until Friday 26 November 2021.

If we are able to collect a million pennies, this will raise £10,000, which will support our vital work.
