## All Saints' Day November 1st

## All Soul's Day November 2nd

All Saints' Day is a day to celebrate all the saints of the Church, both known and unknown. Saints are people who have lived exemplary Christian lives and have been officially recognised by the Church as being in heaven. All Saints' Day is a joyous occasion, and it is a time to reflect on the lives of the saints and to be inspired by their example.



All Souls' Day is a day to pray for the souls of all the faithful departed, traditions include attending Mass, visiting graves, lighting candles and praying for the souls of loved ones to help them achieve purification before entering heaven. It is seen as a day to remember all individuals from family and friends to those who have no one to pray for them.

## Bonfire Night - 5<sup>th</sup> November



Bonfire Night is celebrated to commemorate the failure of the Gunpowder Plot of 1605. Guy Fawkes, along with a small group of plotters, planned to blow up the Houses of Parliament and assassinate King James 1st. The plot was discovered and parliament and the King were saved.

In 1606 King James 1st declared that November 5th would be a day of thanksgiving; the first celebrations involved lighting fires to show relief that the King was safe.

Over time the celebrations became more elaborate and today, Bonfire night (also known as Guy Fawkes night) is widely celebrated across the UK with large bonfires and the burning of 'guys' (effigies of Guy Fawkes). People also enjoy traditional foods like toffee apples, sausages and potatoes baked on the fire.

If you are attending a celebrations or having a bonfire of your own do enjoy yourselves; remember to take care when lighting fireworks and make sure pets are kept safe indoors.

## Remembrance Day, Tuesday 11th November 2025

### What does Lest We Forget mean?

The literal translation of the phrase "Lest We Forget" is "it should not be forgotten".

As mentioned above, it is commonly heard during Remembrance Day when commemorations take place across the UK with thousands of wreaths laid at war memorials to honour the fallen and the sacrifices they made.

Along with wreath laying at War memorials, around the country a two minute silence is observed. "Lest We Forget" is often inscribed on war memorials and graves.



## Movember ( a play on the month November)

Movember is a popular movement that began in the U.S. to raise awareness and donations for men's health issues such as suicide and cancer.



Now popular the world over, it is promoted as a no-shave month during which men grow out their moustaches. People, friends and colleagues continue to hold Movember competitions—who can grow the longest, best or bushiest moustaches/beards. #### *Autumn Prayer*

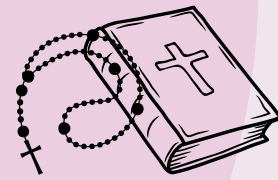
